

Reasons for Publishing this Document (1)


- GRDA will soon be launching the REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY.

A Brief Look at the Numbers: Entities seeking EU funds (2020)



Beneficiary Groups: Malta


Private Companies averaged 17% over 14 year period






Beneficiary Groups: Comparison

Private Companies in EU averaged 46%




The figures represent only expenditure under direct and indirect management.

Private Companies in Cyprus averaged 54%




The figures represent only expenditure under direct and indirect management
